

# **Carrying out a Survey**

Before writing and carrying out a survey, your team needs to determine the information you would like find out! Also, remember to keep in mind the 'Targeting your Audience' tips so that you have a clear idea of who you'll be asking to complete your survey.

### Questions

#### Tips for writing your questions:

- Use 'closed questions. These are questions that require a yes or no answer, e.g. *Do you leave the lights on in an empty room?*
- Avoid 'open' questions. These are questions where a person could give a variety of information in their answer e.g. Why do you think that most of Ireland's energy is produced from non-renewable sources of energy? This can make your results complicated and hard to tell others about.
- You could also ask questions that give people a choice of answers for more detailed feedback while keeping a simple structure, e.g. Do you leave the lights on in an empty room? (a) never (b) sometimes (c) often

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## **Introducing your Survey**

It's important that when approaching someone to fill out a survey, that the person understands **what** the survey is about and **consents** to filling it out. Ex: "Hello. We are doing a survey about... " / "Would you mind answering some questions, please?"

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It is also important that before you conduct your survey, you have thought about **where** and **when** you will carry it out. Think about

- 1) what is the best location to reach my target audience?
- **2)** what is the best time to reach them? e.g. *if your audience is your peers then doing a survey at your local supermarket during school hours or over school holidays might not be the best idea.*

#### **Additional Tips**

- Keep your survey short
- Make sure to leave enough space for people's answers
- Be sure you have permission to carry out your survey (at the location and with the person you are asking)
- Decide on the number of people you want to survey and photocopy that number of sheets. \*Remember, if there is more than one page be sure to copy double sided to save paper!
